ellow: Butter Up/SW #6681

Imitate the sunshine outside with a splash of yellow paint side. Repeat the color in textured pillows and patterned from rugs to spread brightness around your room. Open the indows to drench the room in natural light and place mirrors and shiny accessories around the room to bring shimmer to every corner. Do your windows have shutters?
